There will also be gospel music by the combined choirs of St. James and Payne AME Church as well as readings from Dr. King's writings.

-Isaiah 49:3

"Brothers and sisters:

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." -1 Corinthians 12:4-7

The first reading from Isaiah calls forth a share in the prophetic voice of God. From this sprung a friendship and close relationship with Rev. Dr. King, which lasted many years. Questions and answers will provide us with personal insight from someone who carries on the legacy of Rev. King, who is recognized as not only a great civil rights leader but also a true prophet who has inspired us for half a century. The hourlong program will be held this Sunday at 2 p.m. and will be inspirational and informative for the entire family. Most of all, it will be a chance for the entire area to come together in the spirit of cooperation and prayer.
